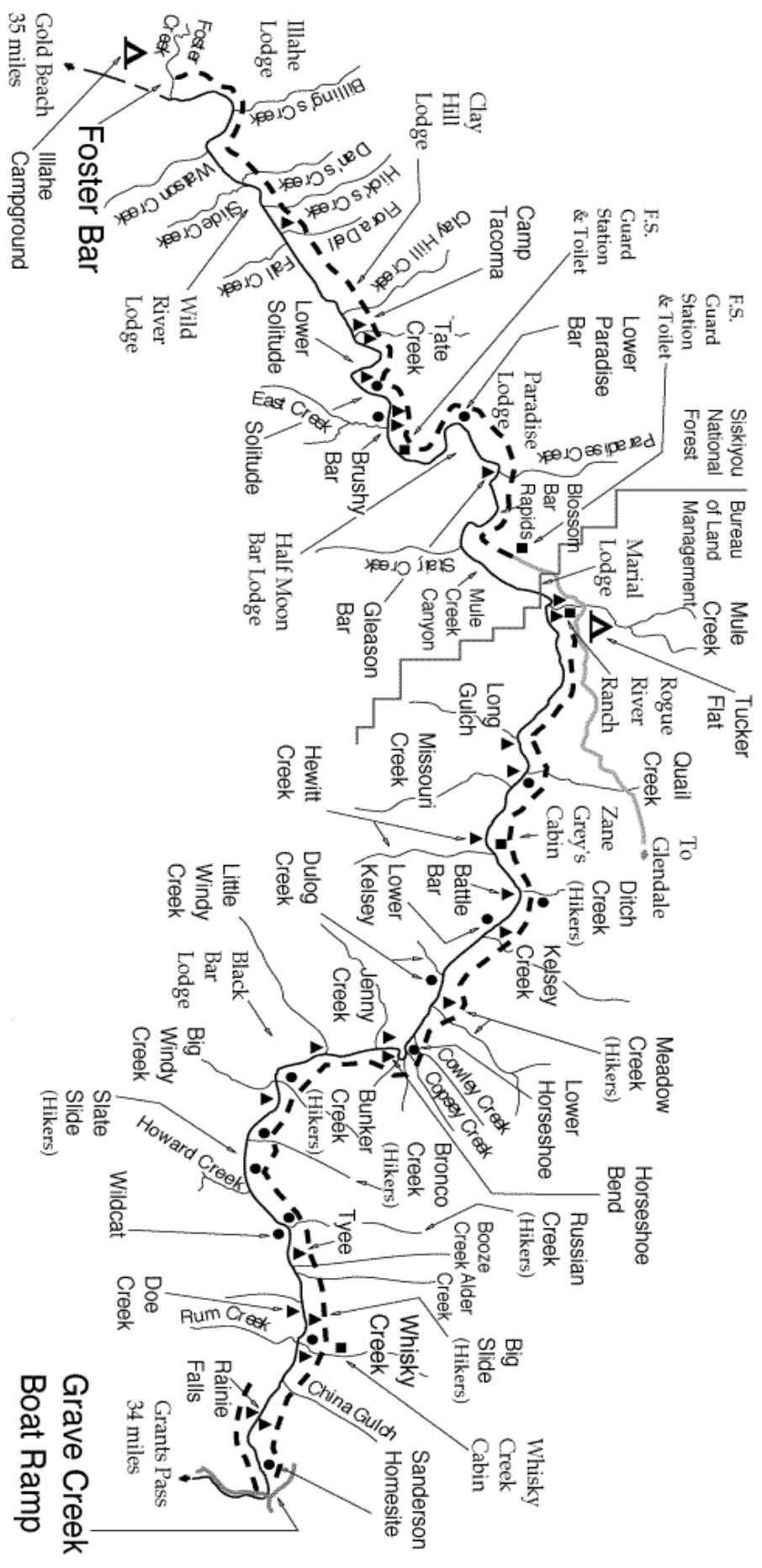


Mile	Landmark	Description
0.0	Grave Creek	Make sure you start on the same side as the boat ramp
1.1	Sanderson Ridge	The concrete piers visible on both sides of the river.
2.1	China Gulch	
4.4	Alder Creek	Lou Martin (see mile 3.1) mined for gold here, but was unsuccessful.
4.7	Booze Creek	Hardrock mining was attempted here but no gold was found.
5.8	Russian Creek	Named after a Russian gold prospector who lived in the area.
7.6	Bronco Creek	This was originally Jackass Creek (1855).
9.1	Bunker Creek	
9.6	Black Bar Lodge	[south bank]. Black Bar is named after William Black who was killed here
11.8	Shady Creek	
12.1	Francis Creek	
12.3	Copsey Creek	Price Copsey mined the area around Horseshoe Bend.
12.4	Cowley Creek	
13.6	Meadow Creek	Miners used a winch to move large boulders on the bar.
15.4	Kelsey Creek	The creek and Kelsey Canyon are named for Colonel John Kelsey.
15.5	Corral Creek	
16.6	Ditch Creek	Former placer mining activity as evidenced by the piles of gravel scattered about the creek.
19.4	Quail Creek	Site of the Quail Creek Fire of 1970.
23.0	Rogue River Ranch	Rogue River Ranch is on the National Register of Historic Places.
23.2	Marial Road	follow to the west.
23.5	Mule Creek	...The tale ended happily several years later when Williamson found his mule.
24.3	Marial Lodge	Private lodge, reservations required.
24.4	Mule Creek Guard	Is a historic U. S. Forest Service - no longer staffed and no longer has drinking water available.
25.0	Trailhead	End of road with pullout for 6 cars
25.5	Coffeepot	The trail overlooks the Coffeepot, a churning semi-whirlpool
25.6	Stair Creek	[south bank]. Stair Creek Falls
25.7	Inspiration Point	Inspiration Point overlooks Stair Creek Falls from the .
27.1	Blossom Bar	Named after the wild azaleas that bloom here.
27.9	Paradise Creek	Cascades over a rock wall into the Rogue from the north.
28.3	Paradise Bar Lodge	Private lodge, reservations required.
31.2	Brushy Bar	Water (needs treating) and emergency radio June through Sept
32.9	Tate Creek	About 200 yards up the creek is a natural water slide that drops 25 feet into a deep fresh pool.
33.2	Clay Hill	Private lodge, reservations required.
34.8	Flora Dell Creek	Flora Dell Creek plunges over a 30 foot sheer wall into a deep trailside pool.
35.8	Hicks Creek	camping
36.2	Dans Creek	
39.0	Big Bend	Site of the last Indian battle of the 1855-1856 wars.
39.0	Ilahae Lodge	Reservations required
40.0	Foster Bar/Creek	. Named after Charles Foster, miner, packer and lieutenant in the military
41.0	Illahae Campground	Camping - Developed USFS fee campground, accessible by car
